


How was funding determined for the program?

Timeline


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- 2013 Dementia Care Specialist (DCS) pilot project initiated in five aging and disability resource centers (ADRCs).
 - 2014 Pilot expanded to 11 additional ADRCs, totaling 16 ADRCs.
 - 2015 Additional DCS pilot project funded in three Wisconsin tribes to serve Native American communities.
 - 2017 2017–19 state budget included ongoing funding for 19 DCS positions; expanded program to 24 DCS positions.
 - 2018 Five additional ADRCs were awarded DCS funding.
 - 2019 2019–21 state budget included eight new positions for counties and one new position for tribes.
 - 2021 2021–2023 state budget included funding for the program to expand statewide.




Memory Screening Evaluation

- Funded by an Administration on Aging grant, 2009–2011
- Implemented by the Portage County ADRC
- Utilized the Animal Naming and Mini-Cog screens
- Collected data from 243 screens

Lessons Learned

- Framework must be flexible.
- Three pillars work together.
- People want memory screening.
- Volunteer coalitions extend reach.
- Tribal programs are the same, and different.
- Plain language and names are important.
- Family caregivers use the program the most.

Impact

- Program is still evolving.
- Evaluation is needed.
- Program is the backbone that sustains many activities.
