



Adopt a Vet Dental Program Reno, Nevada

Program Overview

The Adopt a Vet Dental (AAVD) Program provides pro bono dental care to northern Nevada's low-income Veterans who cannot afford to see a dentist. Most of these Veterans do not have a family or support system, which forces them to rely on help from community resources, such as AAVD. Dentists, oral surgeons, and dental specialists from northern Nevada volunteer their services to address the Veterans' needs for comprehensive oral health care.

Program History and Development



The Adopt a Vet Dental Program was started by two Veteran advocates in 2010 as a Veterans Outreach Program. Its goal was to provide care for the Veterans who do not qualify for treatment at the Department of Veterans Affairs Dental Clinic. Most of the Veterans served do not have dental insurance and have an average income of \$900 per month or less.

In 2011, as the program grew, AAVD was incorporated as a nonprofit organization. AAVD merged with Northern Nevada Dental Health in 2013 to

accelerate the process for providing dental care to Veterans with low incomes and to provide sustainability and growth for the program. It is now administered by the federally qualified health center, Community Health Alliance.

Program Sustainability

- The majority of this program's funding comes from tax-deductible donations from various organizations, businesses, and individuals.
- AAVD is staffed by local volunteer dentists, oral surgeons, and other specialists. As of 2014, the program had 123 participating providers.
- Several major labs subsidize or completely cover the expenses from the prosthetic treatment provided at the labs. In 2014, 17 dental labs participated.

Program Impact

- From 2010-2014, this program provided dental services worth \$1,697,539 to 542 veterans.
- AAVD received the 2014 Newman's Own Award as a nonprofit organization that improves military quality of life.
- According to data from the Adopt a Vet Dental Program, for every \$1 donated to AAVD, \$6.50 worth of dental services is provided.
